Louisiana Beef Industry Council Minutes November 3, 2023

The Council reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting.

<u>Financial Report:</u>

Peter Barrios presented the financial report to the Council. The Council asked Peter to bring a project list to the next meeting showing all approved projects and denote whether they have been paid or not paid.

Public Comment:

Mike Bove, Associated Grocers, spoke to the Council about potential meat cutting classes and expressed his interest on getting more information on this topic.

Funding Requests:

Dr. Christine Navarre, LSU AgCenter, presented a proposal for a bovine injection and ear implant simulator for the Louisiana Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) Certification Program. The Louisiana BQA Certification Program certifies approximately two hundred cattle producers per year. A cornerstone of the BQA Program is proper injection techniques and ear implantation techniques. Live cattle demonstrations are used whenever possible but are not always feasible. The Bovine Injection Simulator will allow participants in the program to practice proper injection techniques when live animals are not available. The model is realistic yet small enough to be portable and taken to any venue. This injection simulator will enhance the learning experience for Louisiana cattlemen participating in the BQA Program. She will attend the next meeting to propose the funding request.

2024 Ag Expo will take place on January 12th & 13th at the Ike Hamilton Expo Center in West Monroe. The LBIC will share a booth with LCA.
